2021 Cub Family Weekend

REGISTRATION

Please complete registration information for each rank and turn it all in at the same time as a pack. This will help make the check-in process much easier for staff and participants. The registration fee includes a patch, program supplies, event insurance, and a free T-shirt (if pre-registered).

Registration is **\$25 per single Scout family** and **\$10 for each additional Scout**. For instance, if you have 2 registered Scouts in your family, your fee would be \$35, \$45 for three Scouts, etc. Additional T-shirts may be purchased for parents or siblings at the cost of **\$10.00 each up to size XL. \$12.00 for sizes XXL and up**. These additional T-shirts must be paid for in advance at the time of registration.

Registration includes a t-shirt for each Cub Scout if received in the council office by close of business on Friday October 8th for Camp Patten and Friday October 22nd for Camp Osborn.

All registrations received AFTER these dates, will be \$35 per family (additional \$10 fees still apply for multiple Scouts). All registrations after these dates will not include a t-shirt.

CAMPING

Campsites for each pack will be designated and assigned by staff. It is very important to have accurate numbers of those camping on the registration form so enough room can be reserved for everyone in the Pack.

While not required, each pack is encouraged to decorate their campsite to fit the theme. We will give out an award for best decorated campsite at the Campfire Program. When planning your designs please adhere to the Guide to Safe Scouting rules and regulations, some of which are mentioned below.

Cooking may be done on charcoal grills, wood fires or approved stoves under adequate supervision. Campfires must be **off the ground** or in designated fire rings in accordance with BSA Leave No Trace Policy. All Packs are asked to follow Leave No Trace Guidelines.

Each Pack is responsible for providing adequate fire prevention equipment at their campsite. Water buckets should be filled and placed near the cook areas. Fire extinguishers are highly recommended in addition to water buckets.

It is the responsibility of each pack to haul their trash from campsite to dumpsters.

SATURDAY PROGRAM

A basic schedule for the weekend is listed in this leader's guide. A more detailed schedule will be given to each leader at the leaders meeting Friday night.

Opening Ceremony will be conducted at the flagpole area at 9:00 am. Please form your Pack in an orderly fashion.

CAMPFIRE PROGRAM

Campfire Program begins at 7:00 pm. During the program, we will award the winners of the activities of the day, be entertained by skits and songs, and have special recognition, and lots of **FUN!!!**

At the Cubmaster/Leaders' Meeting on Friday evening, Cubmasters and leaders will need to provide the Cub Family Weekend Chairman a skit or song that his/her Pack will perform at Saturday's Campfire Program.

SUNDAY INTERFAITH SERVICE

An interfaith service will be held at 8:30 am Sunday morning.

POLICY ON ALCOHOL, DRUGS, TOBACCO, AND PROFANITY

The Boy Scouts of America expressly forbid alcoholic beverages of any kind. This will result in immediate ejection from the event. Any individual in the possession of or consuming any alcoholic beverages will be asked to leave the event. This rule will be strictly enforced. Drugs and controlled substances are ILLEGAL and are ABSOLUTELY FORBIDDEN.

The Boy Scouts of America prohibits the use of tobacco products in the presence of a Scout. Smoking will only be allowed in the designated area and not within the presence of youth.

HEALTH AND SAFETY ISSUES

No Scout shall ride in the cargo area of station wagons, trucks or vans.

No alcoholic beverages, fireworks or personal firearms.

In accordance with BSA policy, no adult shall sleep in a tent with a child other than his/her own child.

Siblings are welcome but shall be the sole responsibility of the parents.

No motorized vehicles or tools such as go-carts, four-wheelers or chain saws are allowed.

Checkout

Each unit should check out with the camp director or designee prior to departure.

Patches will be distributed upon checkout.
